#### FROM THE PASTOR:

They preached the gospel and won a large number of disciples. Then they returned to strengthen the disciples and encouraging them to remain true to the faith.

(Acts 14:21-22)

Today we hear the word "evangelical" kicked around and has devolved into a political sound bite for headlines and political action. But "evangelical" is as ancient as the scriptures, derived from the Greek word meaning "gospel" or "good news." Evangelical Christians believe in the authority of the Bible, a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and the importance of sharing the "good news" (gospel) of salvation through faith in Jesus.

Quickly, we see that evangelical Christians are different from and set apart from society, culture, other religions, and, in some cases, even other derivations of Christianity. At its heart is a one-on-one relationship with God through Jesus Christ, a confidence in the authority of God's word, and a commitment to share the good news of Jesus with others. Evangelicals are called to be holy. That's what holy means— to be set apart. Our question should be, "What exactly does that look like?"

While Jesus focused much of his time and effort on Israel, the Resurrected Christ intentionally and purposefully called Paul to be the voice and interpreter of his teachings to the gentiles (non-Jews). Today, just as in Paul's time, his teachings in the name of Christ continue to be relevant.

Beginning in May, we will begin a message series entitled "In Search of the Holy," where the idea of holiness began and what did God use as its foundation. Following that, through the summer months and into next year, we will focus on Paul's letters to the churches he planted— the Church in Rome through the Church in Thessalonica.

Paul, by his own words, was "the worst of sinners." We should find comfort and encouragement in that, as Paul, being transformed, converted and led by the Holy Spirit of Christ, teaches and interprets Jesus' teachings and commands for his church.
